

# **Customer's Declaration for VAT Relief**

### HMRC website: 1.3 Terminology

The term 'disabled' is used throughout this document and means 'disabled or those with chronic illnesses'.

#### Note to customer

You should complete this declaration if you are 'chronically sick or disabled' and the goods or services are for your own personal or domestic use. A family member or carer can complete this on your behalf if you wish.

## HMRC staff cannot advise whether an individual is chronically sick or disabled.

A person is 'chronically sick or disabled' if he or she is a person:

- 1. with a physical or mental impairment which has a long term and substantial adverse effect upon his or her ability to carry out everyday activities
- 2. with a condition which the medical profession treats as a chronic condition

It does not include an elderly person who is not disabled or chronically ill or any person who is only temporarily disabled or incapacitated, such as with a broken limb.

If you are unsure, you should seek guidance from your GP or other medical professional.
